Today We Celebrate the Feast of the Trinity. While the church calendar celebrates many different people and events during the year, today is the only day that celebrates a doctrine. Although the word "trinity" does not appear in scripture, in the fourth century two church councils emphatically affirmed the trinity in the face of heresies that diminished the divinity of Christ. These early theologians saw that scripture shows us a Triune God: Jesus is God the Son, who from eternity was with God the Father (John 1:1-14, Philippians 2:5-11), and the Holy Spirit is a Person of the same kind (John 14:16, 26). As we celebrate this doctrine, may the perfect love and unity within the Triune God characterize our relationships within the body of Christ (John 17:20-23).



Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.


All: It is right to give him thanks and praise.

Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Celebrant: Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Celebrant: And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

If that doesn't describe you, simply say "Blessing," or cross your arms, and the minister distributing bread will pray a short prayer for God's favor on your life. The first tray contains wine; the second contains grape juice. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. If you would like to receive prayer, a prayer minister is available.
