MORNING PRAYER

OPENING SENTENCE

ISAIAH 57:15

Thus says the high and lofty One who inhabits eternity, whose name is Holy, "I dwell in the high and holy place and also with the one who has a contrite and humble spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble and to revive the heart of the contrite."

THE INVITATORY AND PSALTER

Officiant: Lord, open our lips.

People: And our mouth shall proclaim your praise.

JUBILATE PSALM 100

- ³⁵He changed deserts into pools of water and dry land into water-springs.
- ³⁶He settled the hungry there, and they founded a city to dwell in.
- ³⁷ They sowed fields, and planted vineyards, and brought in a fruitful harvest.
- ³⁸He blessed them, so that they increased greatly; he did not let their herds decrease.
- ³⁹Yet when they were diminished and brought low, through stress of adversity and sorrow,
- ⁴⁰ (He pours contempt on princes and makes them wander in trackless wastes)
- ⁴¹He lifted up the poor out of misery and multiplied their families like flocks of sheep.
- ⁴² The upright will see this and rejoice, but all wickedness will shut its mouth.
- ⁴³Whoever is wise will ponder these things, and consider well the mercies of the LORD.

At the end of the Psalms is sung or said Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen. Alleluia!

LESSON

1 CORINTHIANS 1:18-31

¹⁸ For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. ¹⁹ For it is written:

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise; the intelligence of the intelligent I will frustrate."

²⁰Where is the wise person? Where is the teacher of the law? Where is the philosopher of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? ²¹ For since in the wisdom of God the world through its wisdom did not know him, God was pleased through the foolishness of what was preached to save those who believe. ²² Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom, ²³ but we preach Christ crucified: a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, ²⁴ but to those whom God has called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. ²⁵ For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.

²⁶Brothers and sisters, think of what you were when you were called. Not many of you were wise by human standards; not many were influential; not many were of noble birth. ²⁷ But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong. ²⁸ God chose the lowly things of this world and the despised things—and the things that are not—to nullify the things that are, ²⁹ so that no one may boast before him. ³⁰ It is because of him that you are in Christ Jesus, who has become for us wisdom from God—that is, our righteousness, holiness and redemption. ³¹ Therefore, as it is written: "Let the one who boasts boast in the Lord."

Reader: The Word of the Lord. People: Thanks be to God

INTRODUCTION

These are exhausting and overwhelming days. There are more things to think about, worry about, grieve over, and decide how to navigate than any one person can manage. It may seem counterintuitive, then, to take time away from all of that, to be silent and pray. But the example we see from Jesus' life, is that these times that are busiest and most fraught, are the most important times to get away to pray--to be still before the Lord, to fix our eyes on Jesus, to cast our cares on him who cares for us. Consider this time a gift of rest in a wearying time. Come just as you are. Jesus has already prepared this space for you.

This song by Bifrost Arts is based on Psalm 126, a prayer for renewal and rest. As you listen, allow yourself to be drawn into this special time set apart for you today.

ENTERING THE SILENCE

The next few hours have been set aside for you as a gift from the Lord, an opportunity for your soul to meet with God, a space for you to experience rest. At the beginning of today's journey, you may want to start with a simple quieting practice. Although many of us long for moments of silence and stillness, once we have the space for it, it takes some time and intentionality to enter into it. Here are some simple suggestions to begin:

- Find a place to sit where you can be alert and comfortable. Or, if moving your body helps silence your heart and mind, find a place to walk that will be mostly uninterrupted.
- Set a small, reasonable goal for time to be completely silent, refraining even from reading, writing, etc. for maybe 5-10 minutes.
- Take some deep breaths, noticing tension or anxiety in your mind and body.
- Ask God to give you a brief prayer or phrase to express your intention, desire or need for this time. It can be as simple as, "Help, Lord," or "Peace," or "Here I am."
- Allow the silence to fill your mind and body as you focus on God's nearness. Allow yourself to let go of whatever else comes to mind, perhaps using your brief prayer phrase to bring your attention back.

O God, in the course of this busy life, give us times of refreshment and peace; and grant that we may so use our leisure to rebuild our bodies and renew our minds, that our spirits may be opened to the goodness of your creation; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. ¹

THE GIFT OF THE BEATITUDES

Over the next few hours, take time to meditatively consider Matthew 5:1-12, what we generally refer to as the Beatitudes. Remember that these are not commandments of how to live, but a proclamation of good news to all who have ears to hear. Whatever, or whoever is on your heart and mind today, bring those things to Jesus and this word of grace.

LECTIO DIVINA

As you read, the process of Lectio Divina, or Devotional Reading, may help you enter into the text more fully. Traditionally, this consists of five movements. (Note, there is no time limit to any of these stages. Stay with them as long as it's helpful.)

- Silencio: Quiet yourself in the presence of God.
- *Lectio*: Read the passage slowly, perhaps out loud, pausing on any words or phrases that resonate with you. Stay with those words or phrases, asking God to speak to you in them, without judgement.
- *Meditatio*: Read the passage again, listening for any invitation God may have for you in the words or phrases that you are noticing. You may consider journaling with those words, or using art materials to meditate on them. You might take a walk, and hold the words in your mind.
- Oratio: Read the passage a third time and talk to God about what is coming up for you in this reading. Try to be as honest as possible. The goal is not to have a particular response, but to be with God in your response and see what he has for you.
- Contemplatio: Sit with what has come up for you. Ask for the grace to be open to what God is inviting you towards. Wait on God, and let the good news sink into your heart and mind.

¹Now when Jesus saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, ² and he began to teach them.

VISIO DIVINA

The gift of visio divina, like lectio divina, is the space this practice provides to slow down and allow a story, image, or moment to unfold with more complexity. The beauty of a painting is that it can work on other parts of ourselves--our hearts, our souls and our minds--that we may not generally experience.

Consider using this painting as part of your meditation on the Beatitudes today. As you sit with this painting, ask God to open your heart and mind to his word of grace in this scene.



- ¹⁻²When Jesus saw his ministry drawing huge crowds, he climbed a hillside. Those who were apprenticed to him, the committed, climbed with him. Arriving at a quiet place, he sat down and taught his climbing companions. This is what he said:
- ³ "You're blessed when you're at the end of your rope. With less of you there is more of God and his rule.
- ⁴ "You're blessed when you feel you've lost what is most dear to you. Only then can you be embraced by the One most dear to you.
- ⁵ "You're blessed when you're content with just who you are—no more, no less. That's the moment you find yourselves proud owners of everything that can't be bought.
- ⁶"You're blessed when you've worked up a good appetite for God. He's food and drink in the best meal you'll ever eat.
- ⁷ "You're blessed when you care. At the moment of being 'care-full,' you find yourselves cared for.
- ⁸ "You're blessed when you get your inside world—your mind and heart—put right. Then you can see God in the outside world.
- ⁹ "You're blessed when you can show people how to cooperate instead of compete or fight. That's when you discover who you really are, and your place in God's family.
- ¹⁰ "You're blessed when your commitment to God provokes persecution. The persecution drives you even deeper into God's kingdom.

11-12 "Not only that—count yourselves blessed every time people put you down or throw you out or speak lies about you to discredit me. What it means is that the truth is too close for comfort and they are uncomfortable. You can be glad when that happens—give a cheer, even!—for though they don't like it, I do! And all heaven applauds. And know that you are in good company. My prophets and witnesses have always gotten into this kind of trouble.

MUSIC MEDITATION

Sometimes a simple song based on Scripture helps us to meditate on its truth. You may want to use one of the following songs, based on Matthew 5, to further your reflection.
