About Our Worship: We use an Anglican liturgy. Liturgy simply means that everyone gets to participate, so please join in as you feel comfortable.

Children's Worship: Nursery is available for children 6 months through 4 years. Children's Worship rooms are available for children Kindergarten through 2nd Grade, and 3rd to 5th Grade. You may choose to keep children with your family, and coloring pages will be available to all.

Assisted Listening or Noise Cancelling Headphones: Pick up a loop in the livestream booth (the door to the right of the fireplace in the Fireside Room). An usher can guide you there. Noise cancelling headphones are also available at the info table for those who might be sensitive to noise.

Today is the Fifteenth week after Pentecost, and during this season of Ordinary Time we are looking at key people and practices of the Anglican Church. Today we ask: why do the ministers wear special clothing? By about the sixth century, as the Roman Empire disintegrated, clergy held on to the traditional clothing associated with education and Roman culture, and with some variations many clergy have worn this traditional clothing throughout the centuries since. At Savior, the priests, deacons and Communion ministers all wear white albs. Over the alb, priests and deacons wear stoles, the scarf-like fabric that priests wear around their neck and deacons over their shoulder; Communion ministers wear tabards. Vestments help de-emphasize individual distinctions and communicate reverence toward Word and Sacrament.
