About Today: The word "maundy" comes from the same Latin root as the word "mandate." Maundy Thursday reminds us of the new command Jesus gave to his disciples: "Love one another as I have loved you" (John 13:34). In this service, we begin with footwashing, continue with Communion, and end with a prayer watch, all of which commemorate Jesus' love for his disciples and for all those who would follow him. All: His mercy endures forever.


Officiant: This is the night that Christ the Son of Man gathered with his disciples in the upper room.

THE COLLECT OF THE DAY

Officiant: The Lord be with you.

All: And to also with you.

Officiant: Let us pray.

Almighty Father, whose dear Son, on the night before he suffered, instituted the Sacrament of his Body and Blood: Mercifully grant that we may receive it thankfully in remembrance of Jesus Christ our Lord, who in these holy mysteries gives us a pledge of eternal life; and who now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

¹ While the Israelites were still in the land of Egypt, the Lord gave the following instructions to Moses and Aaron: ² "From now on, this month will be the first month of the year for you. ³ Announce to the whole community of Israel that on the tenth day of this month each family must choose a lamb or a young goat for a sacrifice, one animal for each household. ⁴ If a family is too small to eat a whole animal, let them share with another family in the neighborhood. Divide the animal according to the size of each family and how much they can eat.

¹¹ "These are your instructions for eating this meal: Be fully dressed, wear your sandals, and carry your walking stick in your hand. Eat the meal with urgency, for this is the Lord's Passover. ¹² On that night I will pass through the land of Egypt and strike down every firstborn son and firstborn male animal in the land of Egypt. I will execute judgment against all the gods of Egypt, for I am the Lord! ¹³ But the blood on your doorposts will serve as a sign, marking the houses where you are staying. When I see the blood, I will pass over you. This plague of death will not touch you when I strike the land of Egypt.

¹⁴ This is a day to remember. Each year, from generation to generation, you must celebrate it as a special festival to the Lord. This is a law for all time.

¹⁴In the daytime he led them by a cloud, and all night by a pillar of fire.

¹⁵He split open the rocks in the wilderness to give them water, as from a gushing spring.

¹⁶He made streams pour from the rock, making the waters flow down like a river!

¹⁷Yet they kept on sinning against him, rebelling against the Most High in the desert.

¹⁸ They stubbornly tested God in their hearts, demanding the foods they craved.

¹⁹They even spoke against God himself, saying, "God can't give us food in the wilderness.

²⁰ Yes, he can strike a rock so water gushes out, but he can't give his people bread and meat."

²³But he commanded the skies to open; he opened the doors of heaven.

²⁴He rained down manna for them to eat; he gave them bread from heaven.

²⁵ They ate the food of angels!

God gave them all they could hold.

THE SECOND LESSON

1 CORINTHIANS 11:23-26

²³ For I pass on to you what I received from the Lord himself. On the night when he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread ²⁴ and gave thanks to God for it. Then he broke it in pieces and said, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." ²⁵ In the same way, he took the cup of wine after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant between God and his people—an agreement confirmed with my blood. Do this in remembrance of me as often as you drink it." ²⁶ For every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are announcing the Lord's death until he comes again.

Reader: The Word of the Lord All: Thanks be to God.

You may stand.

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. All: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

¹⁴ When the hour came, Jesus and his apostles reclined at the table. ¹⁵ And he said to them, "I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. ¹⁶ For I tell you, I will not eat it again until it finds fulfillment in the kingdom of God."

 17 After taking the cup, he gave thanks and said, "Take this and divide it among you. 18 For I tell you I will not drink again from the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes."

¹⁹ And he took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body given for you; do this in remembrance of me."

²⁰ In the same way, after the supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you. ²¹ But the hand of him who is going to betray me is with mine on the table. ²² The Son of Man will go as it has been decreed. But woe to that man who betrays him!" ²³ They began to question among themselves which of them it might be who would do this.

²⁴ A dispute also arose among them as to which of them was considered to be greatest. ²⁵ Jesus said to them, "The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those who exercise authority over them call themselves Benefactors. ²⁶ But you are not to be like that. Instead, the greatest among you should be like the youngest, and the one who rules like the one who serves. ²⁷ For who is greater, the one who is at the table or the one who serves? Is it not the one who is at the table? But I am among you as one who serves. ²⁸ You are those who have stood by me in my trials. ²⁹ And I confer on you a kingdom, just as my Father conferred one on me, ³⁰ so that you may eat and drink at my table in my kingdom and sit on thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel.

Deacon: The Gospel of the Lord.
All: Praise to you, Lord Christ.

THE WASHING OF FEET

Officiant: Fellow servants of our Lord Jesus Christ: On the night before his death, Jesus set an example for his disciples by washing their feet, as an act of humble service. We all need to remember his example, but none stand more in need of this reminder than those whom the Lord has called to lead his people. Therefore, I invite you to watch or join me, that we may all remember the example of our Master.

If you are with others, you may wash each other's feet.

If you are alone or prefer not to wash feet, set out a water basin and towel and reflect on these questions:

- 1) What are some ways that I have been served in the past few weeks?
- 2) How might God be inviting me to serve others?

THE CONFESSION OF SIN

Deacon: Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Please sit or kneel during a time of silence.

All: Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your name. Amen.

Officiant: Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. Amen.


THE PEACE

Officiant: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All: And also with you.

THE HOLY COMMUNION

Lamb of God



^{* &}quot;Misrere nobis" is a Latin phrase that means "have mercy on us." Dona nobis pacem" means "grant us peace."

ADMINISTRATION FROM THE RESERVED SACRAMENT

Officiant: Let us pray.

All: We do not presume to come to this your table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in your abundant and great mercies. We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under your table; but you are the same Lord whose character is always to have mercy. Grant us, therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his body, and our souls washed through his most precious blood, and that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.

Officiant: Let us pray in the words our Savior Christ has taught us:

All: Our Father, who art in heaven,
Hallowed be Thy name.
Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done,
On earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread,
And forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us.
And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil,
For thine is the kingdom, and the power,
And the glory forever and ever. Amen.

Officiant: The gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

At this point, all who have the Reserved Sacrament will eat it together. If you do not have the sacrament, you may pray the following prayer.

Prayer for Spiritual Communion

Dear Jesus, I believe that you are truly present in the Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I desire to possess you within my soul. And since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, I beseech you to come spiritually into my heart. I unite myself to you, together with all your faithful people, and I embrace you with all the affections of my soul. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.

- ³ Yet you are enthroned as the Holy One; you are the one Israel praises.

- ⁶ But I am a worm and not a man, scorned by everyone, despised by the people.

They hurl insults, shaking their heads.

8 "He trusts in the LORD," they say,

"let the LORD rescue him.

Let him deliver him, since he delights in him."

- From birth I was cast on you; from my mother's womb you have been my God.
- ¹¹ Do not be far from me, for trouble is near and there is no one to help.

 My heart has turned to wax; it has melted within me.

¹⁵ My mouth is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; you lay me in the dust of death. They pierce my hands and my feet.

¹⁷ All my bones are on display; people stare and gloat over me.

¹⁸ They divide my clothes among them and cast lots for my garment.

- ¹⁹ But you, LORD, do not be far from me. You are my strength; come quickly to help me.
- ²² I will declare your name to my people; in the assembly I will praise you.
- ²³ You who fear the LORD, praise him! All you descendants of Jacob, honor him!
- ²⁴ For he has not despised or scorned the suffering of the afflicted one; he has not hidden his face from him but has listened to his cry for help.
- ²⁵ From you comes the theme of my praise in the great assembly.
- ²⁷ All the ends of the earth will remember and turn to the LORD, and all the families of the nations will bow down before him,
- ²⁸ For dominion belongs to the LORD and he rules over the nations.
- ³⁰ Posterity will serve him; future generations will be told about the Lord.
- ³¹ They will proclaim his righteousness, declaring to a people yet unborn: He has done it!

When they had sung a hymn, they went out to a place called Gethsemane, and Jesus said to his disciples, "My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death. Stay here and keep watch."
