## Welcome to Church of the Savior

**If You are Visiting:** We'd love to meet you! Please connect with our clergy after the service, to introduce yourself and learn more about Church of the Savior. We use an Anglican liturgy. Liturgy simply means that everyone gets to participate, so please join in as you feel comfortable. You can't make a mistake.

**Current Covid Protocol:** Following CDC and state guidelines, we ask that all attenders wear masks during the service. Please pass the Peace with a smile and wave from your seat. After the service, before you move to shake someone's hand or give them a hug, ask first: "May I give you a hug?". We encourage you to greet others outdoors as well.

**Children's Worship:** Nursery is available for children 6 months through 4 years, and Children's Worship is for children Kindergarten through 2nd grade. You may choose to keep children with your family, and coloring pages will be available to all. The Fireside Room will be open for anyone who needs a little extra space, but please sit where you like.

**Today is the Last Week after Pentecost:** We have finally reached the end of Ordinary Time, the longest season of the church year that begins in early summer after Pentecost and ends now, as fall slides into winter. It may seem strange that next week begins a new year in the church calendar: we are still weeks away from the countdown to midnight on December 31st, and weeks beyond the start of the new school year. But Advent asks us to begin anew our walk through the life of Jesus, to remember again our longing for a savior and our need for a light in the darkness. And as the holiday season disrupts our work schedules, Advent reminds us that we are no longer in ordinary time, but instead in a time of anticipation and preparation as we celebrate Jesus' birth and look forward to his return.
