Children's Worship: While services are livestreamed, children and youth are strongly invited to join in alongside everyone else. We will keep the service 10-15 minutes shorter than usual.

Today, on the First Week after Epiphany, we remember the baptism of Jesus. Before he began his ministry, Jesus went with the crowds down to the low, muddy Jordan River and was baptized by a fiery preacher named John. During that baptism, something unusual happened: When Jesus came up out of the water, heaven was torn open and God's spirit descended on Jesus like a dove. A voice from heaven boomed, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:16-17). At Jesus' baptism, God revealed to John and the crowds, just as he still reveals to us, who Jesus really is.

THE NICENE CREED

You may stand.

All: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. I unite myself to you, together with all your faithful people, and I embrace you with all the affections of my soul. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.
