History of Anglicanism in England & North America

History of Christianity in England:

- 1st 6th c. AD: The Celtic Church
- 595: Augustine's mission to England

The English Reformation:

- John Wycliffe (c. 1320 1384): Morning Star of the English reformation
- 16th c. AD: Reformation in Europe: Luther and Calvin

Formation of the Church of England:

- 1534: Henry VIII breaks with Rome
- 1549: Thomas Cranmer constructs the first Book of Common Prayer
- 1553: Mary I returns England to Catholicism
- 1559: Elizabethan Settlement reestablishes the Church of England

History of the Anglican Church in America:

- Before the Revolutionary War: small and scattered
- After the Revolutionary War: how to run an Anglican church apart from English rule

The Episcopal Church:

- 1950s and 60s: growing involvement in social issues
- Key issues that caused dissention in the Episcopal Church: the ordination of women, homosexuality, and the 1979 revision of the Book of Common Prayer
- 1998: the first American church comes under Rwandan authority
- 2000: Anglican Mission in America formed
- 2009: Anglican Church in North America becomes a Province in Formation of the Anglican Communion
